Electronic Lectionary Available

Several years ago I was looking for an easier way to read my daily scripture lessons. Paging back and forth through the Bible seemed to break my attention. I located some Bible software and began the cut and paste process to create a file for each week's lessons, then printing the file for use in the morning. Before long some friends learned I was doing this and asked if I would e-mail a copy of the file to them each week. At this point, I send the lessons out to about forty folks.

The daily lectionary assignments run on a two year cycle rather than the three year cycle for Sundays. In a two year period the reader completes the Hebrew Scripture one time and the New Testament twice. I use the NSRV translation. For Sundays, I copy in the lessons from the three year Sunday Lectionary with the addition of the lesson from the Hebrew Scripture from the daily Lectionary to maintain continuity.

If you would like to receive the Daily Lectionary lessons, visit the FPC website (www.fpccolumbus.org). At the Main page, select "Ministries" and look under "Adult Nurture" and you will see "Daily Lectionary" or you may prefer to send an e-mail to the church office with your request from the e-mail address where you want to receive the lessons (office@fpccolumbus.org with "Lectionary Lessons" in the subject line).

I try to stay about three weeks ahead so if I am out of town or something, I can catch back up. Some folk prefer to read their lessons at the computer rather than print them out. However you prefer, this gets all the lessons for each day together in one place for your study and meditation. It's a great way to start or end the day.

FIRST STEPS TO FORMING A PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Adult Nurture Opportunity for April

Just Eating? Practicing our Faith at the Table --- a New Adult Nurture Class will begin April 23. Just Eating is a four-week course designed to explore the relationship between the way we eat and the way we live. This course has been designed by the Presbyterian Hunger Program to give people tools to help us ponder the wider impact of what we eat.

Join us as we use scripture, prayer and stories from the local and global community to explore four key aspects of Christians' relationship with food:

- the health of our bodies
- the health of the earth that provides our food
- the ways we use food to extend hospitality and enrich relationships
- the challenge of hunger

The title of the course has a double meaning. We can eat as a mundane activity done without mindfulness, or we can eat justly and explore the relationship between our food, justice, and spirituality. Eating can be a vehicle for practicing our faith.

The following is an short excerpt from a wonderful letter from **Kaye Ellen Connor**. I asked her to share her experiences to help us be more mindful of others as we consider our gifts for this offering.

Dear Friends in Christ,

As most of you already know, John and I are in Witbank, South Africa for the next few months.

In my efforts to find a way to help in this depressed area, I have been led to Margaret Henry. Margaret is a lady about my age, the minister of music in her church and the lioness protectorate of the "Creche." Margaret and a small group of Methodist ladies brought about the creation of a Creche (preschool) in the middle of a rather large "shanty town" (their words) and this is what I really want to share with you.

Several hundred homeless people have built a squatters village on a farmers land-uninvited. These people have NO running water, NO electricity, NO automobiles and usually, no jobs.

Their homes have a roof and four outside walls (sod, sheet plastic, tin, wood planks...), some have inside walls, most have doors, none have solid windows, and very few have more than a dirt floor. All homes have a plastic sheet wrapped around a designated area in the yard—remember, no running water, for their open air bathroom. The municipality has built a few water towers—visualize rain catchers. Residents walk to the towers, draw the water they need from a garden hose and tote it back to their homes. The men leaving for work, or to search for a job almost always take the "wheel" with them, so the residents, mostly women, are carrying hundreds of gallons of water a week. Many of the women have already strapped a baby to their back or a toddler to their hips before they carry water. The average life span of the unemployed poor in So. Africa is 48 years.

The Creche, managed by a "teacher," whose name is "Girlie" and her assistant opened the Creche two years ago with 5 students -- there are now 54. Approximately one half are being raised by friends and neighbors because their parents and grandparents are dead—HIV. The teacher is now denying that statistic because the poor believe it's a serious stigma and are ashamed. The reality is that a large percentage of those infected were infected in a medical setting - child birth in particular.

"And the day came when the risk to remain tight in a bud was more painful than the risk it took to blossom." - Anais Nin

For me, both Spring and Easter are about saying YES to life, saying YES to God's creation, saying YES to God's call to blossom more fully into our best selves. It is about letting those parts of us that have been protected in God's womb be birthed into full vitality. Saying YES, often takes risk. However, as this above quote suggests, *do we risk **even more** when we shy away from courageously living our call to blossom?*

Maybe being courageous is openly sharing your feelings with another, rather than keeping them tucked inside; maybe it is about volunteering for something that you know will enhance your life, even though you've hesitated for such a long time; maybe it is reaching out to a neighbor or someone you'd like to know better even though it has seemed easier not to; maybe it is about getting rid of material things that you have held onto for so long because you have feared letting go. The beauty of taking risks is that we never take them alone. When we let our tight buds burst forth in blossoms, God is here to provide the necessary water, light, and nurturing. As Joshua 1:9 says, **"Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for your God will be with you wherever you go."**

1. Weeks don't stretch near the end of the month and the *newsletter deadline* is not a fairy tale. It's a real date after which the staff needs to spend time on layout (which they can't do until they have ALL the contents), publication and mailing. Plan ahead and submit your articles to the church staff *by the required deadline*.
2. Remember that the newsletter has a finite number of pages and lots of important information to transmit. Space limitations may require that your article be edited or deferred until the next month if it's not time-sensitive.
3. Check your article for errors. Is that person's name spelled correctly? Is that the right time for the event? Do the day and the date you've listed match? Although the church staff does the best they can with editing, they can't catch errors in matters about which they have no direct knowledge. Carefully proofread your article before submitting. Better yet, ask a family member or friend to bring their "fresh set of eyes" to your article.
4. Have your article in a format that is as close to "ready to print" as you can before submitting. If you have computer access, send it by email or bring it to the church office on a disk. If you must handwrite it, make it as neat and legible as possible.










Mallory Lynne Mahin
