



Roots to Reading

This class fosters emergent literacy skills and concepts. Students engage in hands-on activities that include picture/word association, letter and word recognition, vocabulary development and phonemic awareness. The curriculum follows the Indiana Academic Standards and utilizes fairy tales and classic children's literature.

In this class students will learn to: generate vocabulary using pictures related to literature, recognize beginning sight words, dictate or write and illustrate a story related to one that was read, retell and reenact fairy tales and stories.

Class is limited to 16 students. Students must register for the entire year. Per class attendance is not permitted. Once registered, there will be no credits for missed classes. Afternoon enrichment class students are welcome to have lunch with Wee Care in the gym before heading to class. Regular Wee Care charges apply.

Marvelous Mathematics

This class fosters emergent mathematical concepts and skills. Students will engage in problem solving while being introduced to a number of mathematical concepts that will become the basis for learning more complex math. Students will use "touch math" to learn basic algebraic operations in addition to simple geometry through common shape and directional work. The curriculum follows the Indiana Academic Standards and will include daily opportunities for reasoning, communication and oral representation to nurture a love of math.

Class is limited to 16 students. Students must register for the entire year. Per class attendance is not permitted. Once registered, there will be no credits for missed classes. Afternoon enrichment class students are welcome to have lunch with Wee Care in the gym before heading to class. Regular Wee Care charges apply.

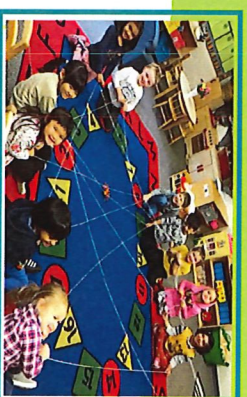

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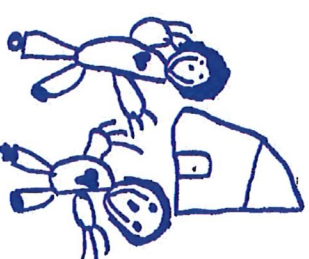
