We strive toward the use of **inclusive language** in our church as it pertains to people and to God.






Join us for a pitch-in BBQ, yard games, bonfire, s'mores, and an optional camp-out (adult supervision of minors required)

This year, the FPC Youth Group has chosen Fireman's Cheer Fund to be the local recipient of the Pentecost Offering.


